

Presented by Andrew Skeoch, a wildlife sound recordist and acoustic ecologist who has recently published the book 'Deep Listening to Nature' - an invitation to tune our ears in to the natural world.

Andrew's presentation will focus on developing an auditory awareness of the natural environment around us, identifying species by their vocalisations, the reasons creatures use the specific calls they do, the dawn chorus and frog communities, empathic listening, and hearing sentience and nurturing care for nature. You'll also find out what listening to nature has to teach us about sustainability.

October Adventure Walking

Alister Lee led us on an interesting and challenging walk around the Tura Headland trails which he planned in three interlinking nodes, beginning and ending at the Tura Headland trail. He introduced many of us to a much more extensive system of trails than we were aware of, some of which are part of the Wharf-to-Wharf Walk which extends from Merimbula to Tathra.



We walked through coastal Melaleucas and open forest to Tura Beach where we joined the Wharf-to-Wharf Walk for a few

hundred metres of beach walking, and up a set of well-made stairs and path back to our starting point. We then walked along the main track to Tura Head where we sighted several whales before diverging to a wide rock shelf where we took our break.

The final node took us back on the Wharf-to-Wharf track towards North Tura beach, and then we looped back over the open field inhabited by many dozing kangaroos.



This month, our group watched 'Where the Crawdads Sing' streaming on Netflix. Not having read the best-selling book by Delia Owens (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Delia Owens), I was drawn to the film by the acting presence of Daisy Edgar-Jones whom I'd seen and admired in the adaptation of Sally Rooney's 'Normal People'. I was keen to hear what other members thought of the film, especially those who had read and enjoyed the novel.

Although well acted by Daisy Edgar-Jones, I personally found the film's storyline too implausible to be taken seriously. However, I persevered and watched until the end. There were mixed reactions from our group with terms such as Chick Flick, Soap Opera and Hollywood Schmalz being used to describe the film in stark contrast to the appreciation of the novel. 
