


Film Review 'Aftersun'

This film screened at the Cannes Film Festival in 2022 and is now streaming on SBS On Demand. It is the first feature for Scottish writer, director Charlotte Wells. It is a beautiful film with a gentle rhythm as it captures tender moments shared by Calum, a young father (Paul Mescal) and Sophie, his eleven-year-old daughter (Frankie Corio), while holidaying together in a run-down coastal resort in Turkey in the 1990's.

Sophie is now an adult (played by Celia Rowlson-Hall), and is reflecting back on this holiday, the last one she had with her father, as she is now the same age as he was then, and has also become a parent.





"Charlotte Wells's debut feature is a stylistically daring, emotionally piercing and beautifully understated tale of love and loss Yet 'Aftersun' is constructed as a very personal recollection, filtered through a haze of memory and imagination by the now-adult Sophie (Celia Rowlson-Hall) looking back on things she didn't really understand at the time." https://www.theguardian.com/film/2022/nov/20/aftersun-review-charlotte-wells-luminous-father-daughter-drama-paul-mescal

"Aftersun" is clearly told from Sophie's point of view, but a perceptive viewer will notice there are scenes where Sophie is not present. The film, then, is from the adult Sophie's point of view, an adult - a new parent herself - looking back on this vacation, curious about what her father must have been going through. 


